

## Soka Gakkai World Seikyo Center



With the facility opening on November 18, 2019, Ikeda Sensei and Mrs. Ikeda toured it on September 28 and offered prayers. Located at its 1F entrance is a monument inscribed with words by Ikeda Sensei honoring everyone's role in the Seikyo Shimbun newspaper's advancement of kosen-rufu.

## Hall of the Great Vow for Kosen-rufu



On November 5, 2013, Ikeda Sensei led the Gohonzon enshrinement ceremony at the facility, which he named the "Hall of the Great Vow for Kosen-rufu" three days later. The Hall is where the formal gongyo session for kosen-rufu is held.

## Soka Bunka (Culture) Center



On December 8, 2012, Ikeda Sensei and his wife Kaneko visited the Kinmai Large Gohonzon Hall for the first time, where they did gongyo and daimoku and later toured. Exhibitions are held on the 3rd and 5th floors, while a Kids Room is next to the rest area on the 2nd floor.

Note: The 6F Kinmai Large Gohonzon Hall is closed to visitors.

In November 1953, the Soka Gakkai Headquarters moved from Tokyo's Nishi-Kanda district to where it stands today in Shinanomachi. Since then, the headquarters has grown in size and scope with the advance of kosen-rufu worldwide.

In 2012, the Soka Bunka (Culture) Center was completed, followed by the Hall of the Great Vow for Kosen-rufu in 2013. To honor the 90th anniversary of the Soka Gakkai in 2020,

the Soka Gakkai World Seikyo Center and Soka Treasure Light Reception Center were built, with SGI members the world over visiting the headquarters every day.

This pamphlet is a map and short guide of the major facilities in the Soka Gakkai Headquarters Complex.
